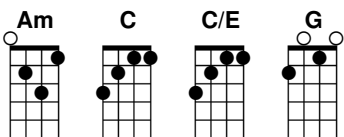




SYMBOL KEY & FAQ

Guidelines for how to play the song will appear here

- 1 Chords are indicated like this [C]
- 2 \square means to repeat the previous chord again.
- 3 Each bracketed chord contains the same number of beats, unless otherwise indicated.
- 4 The first note or notes to be sung are indicated in the header at the top of each page.
- 5
- 6 4/4 = 4 beats per measure
- 7 3/4 = 3 beats per measure
- 8 6/4 = 6 beats per measure
- 9
- 10 Sometimes chords appear faster than 4 beats - this will be indicated at the top
- 11 $\square=2$ count 2 beats per chord
- 12 $\square=1$ count 1 beat per chord
- 13
- 14 Chords can also differ from the norm.
- 15 If $\square=4$ beats, you may see some \square^2 (2 beats), or \square^1 (1 beat)
- 16
- 17 | (chorus)
- 18 | Indented parts like this will be repeated later in the song.
- 19 | If more than 1 repeated block is shown, they'll have a part indicator above
- 20 | them, like this one has (chorus) above it
- 21
- 22 Special 'chords'
- 23 [NC] = No Chord / Tacet (don't strum)
- 24 [X] = Muted strum / Chunk (strum while muting the strings with your left hand)
- 25
- 26 Slash Chords
- 27 [C/E] = Ukulele plays a regular [C], but the BASS plays an E note.
- 28
- 29 Rhythm modifiers
- 30 \square^{ss} = Single Strum (strum once on beat 1, leave silent for remaining beats)
- 31 \square^{ds} = Double Strum (usually in 4/4, strum only on beats 1 and 2)
- 32 \square^{rasq} = "Rasqueado" (**quick strumming, often at the end of a song**)
- 33 \square^{trip} = "Triplet" (play 3 strums in the space of the normal 4)
- 34 \square^{stac} = "Staccato" (play 4 short down strums with muting in between)
- 35 /[G] = Play this chord a half-beat early (on the up-strum)
- 36 [Am]/ = Play this chord a half-beat LATE (this is pretty rare)



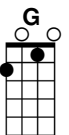
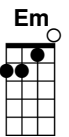
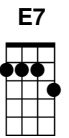
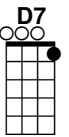
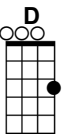
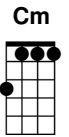
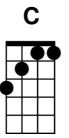
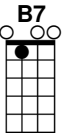
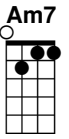
