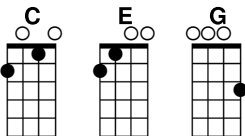

SYMBOL KEY & FAQ

Guidelines for how to play the song will appear here



- 1 Chords are indicated like this [C]
- 2 \square means to repeat the previous chord again.
- 3 Each bracketed chord contains the same number of beats,
- 4 unless otherwise indicated with a superscript number after the chord
- 5 [C]³ would mean a C major chord, played for 3 beats.
- 6 The first note or multiple notes to be sung are indicated in the
- 7 header at the top of each page like **Sing [C]-[C]/[E]**
- 8 This would mean to sing 2 C notes, then go / (up) to an E note.
- 9
- 10 The key signature can be one of these:
- 11 4/4 = 4 beats per measure
- 12 3/4 = 3 beats per measure
- 13 6/8 = 6 beats per measure
- 14
- 15 Sometimes chords appear faster than 4 beats - this will be indicated at the top
- 16 $\square=2$ count 2 beats per chord instead of the default for the key signature
- 17 $\square=1$ count 1 beat per chord
- 18
- 19 Each bracketed chord may also vary during the song, and this is indicated by
- 20 a superscript number after the bracket.
- 21 \square^2 (2 beats for this chord), or \square^1 (1 beat)
- 22
- 23 | Indented parts like this will be repeated later in the song.
- 24 | This is usually a chorus, but may also be a repeated bridge or verse.
- 25
- 26 Special 'chords'
- 27 [NC] = No Chord / Tacet (don't strum)
- 28 [X] = Muted strum / Chunk (strum while muting the strings with your left hand)
- 29
- 30 (chorus) - repeat the chorus
- 31
- 32 Slash Chords for bass players
- 33 [C/E] = Ukulele plays a regular [C], but the BASS plays an E note.
- 34
- 35 Rhythm modifiers
- 36 \square^{ss} = Single Strum (strum once on beat 1, leave silent for remaining beats)
- 37 \square^{ds} = Double Strum (usually in 4/4, strum only on beats 1 and 2)
- 38 \square^{rasq} = "Rasqueado" (**quick strumming, often at the end of a song**)
- 39 \square^{trip} = "Triplet" (play 3 strums in the space of the normal 2)
- 40 \square^{stac} = "Staccato" (strum once for each beat, muting the strings in between)
- 41 /[G] = Play this chord a half-beat early (on the up-strum)
